Required Reading for all students: Wonder by R.J. Palacio.

1. Main Summer Reading Essay Assignment:

Please write and then type a three- four paragraph essay and outline in which you explore one of the themes you have encountered in Wonder (for example, themes include: family, appearances, isolation, friendship, kindness, courage, coming of age, etc.). Please take some time to organize your thoughts and write an outline first.

Your essay must include:

1. A cover page.
2. An introduction with: The title and author of the book you are discussing.
4. Body Paragraph
5. A conclusion.

2. Second Reading Assignment:

1. Choose one book from the suggested reading list below.
2. Please write 3-4 paragraphs in which you present a summary and opinion of the book you selected.
3. This second piece of writing should be formatted as follows:

An introduction with:

1. A clear topic/leading sentence. title and author of the book. (1 paragraph)
2. A summary of the book. (1 paragraph)
3. Your opinion/reflection on the book – likes, dislikes, commendations, critiques, and evidence from the book to support your opinion. (Last paragraph)
