

Grade 5th Summer Reading Assignment


During the summer, students are expected to read *Wringer* by Jerry Spinelli.

We will discuss the novel the first week of school in September.

Each student is to write 3-4 paragraphs in which he/she presents a summary, discuss the main characters, and opinion of the book *Wringer*. You are to type your assignment.
